FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

My, how time flies! It seems like Lent has just started and I realize that Easter is almost on us. Palm Sunday is this coming Sunday, as I write this. My regret is that I have hardly had the time to really focus on this Church Season as I would like. But that's so true with so many things!

This has always been a special season for me since my Father died in 1949. As I have no doubt told you before, he was buried on Good Friday of that year, and I have always found that to be a meaningful event for me. What I have come to realize is that Easter is not a time to focus on DEATH, but it is a time to celebrate LIFE! The LIFE I am referring to has a dual meaning. First, it refers to the quality LIFE God has given us through a relationship with his Son, Jesus Christ. To live a life in, with, and for Christ is to truly experience this earthly LIFE with a quality only God can offer. Such a LIFE enables us to laugh when there is something funny to laugh about: it also enables us to laugh when there is truly nothing apparent to laugh about! Such a LIFE enables us to smile assuringly and confidently around others with whom we come into contact. It also enables us to smile when we would rather tend to punish ourselves for our mistakes and faults. Such a LIFE enables us to ask forgiveness for our human weaknesses in the confidence that God will willingly and gladly extend his loving hand of forgiveness. Such a quality of LIFE is worth every minute – no, every second – of our breathing, because it enables us to see ourselves as persons not only deserving of love but recipients of God's and our own self-love!

The second half of the dual meaning of the celebration of LIFE is the one that begins at the moment of death. This aspect of our celebration is what we usually associate with Easter celebration. We are assured in scripture that Jesus' resurrection constitutes the victory over death that God also offers each one of us as believers through our faith and trust in Him! But notice: our being assured by scripture and our "faith" in Jesus Christ just that – FAITH, not proof. There are those who would view our Easter worship through skeptics' eyes. They believe in nothing but empirical scientific evidence. You know, however? That kind of thinking takes the real vitality of life out of the equation! If we only believe in what we can see, most of us would be motionless. If we only have faith in what is provable, think of all the joy we would miss. A successful marriage based on genuine respect and intimacy is not subject to proof beforehand. True discovery in human life is based on someone stepping out in faith, trusting that some unknown discovery vital to human life is just a few more steps or experiments away. Exploration of every form – albeit in space or in the realms of thought – requires one who is willing to take the gamble – the RISK – of faith.

I invite you to experience LIFE this Easter. At Holland UMC, we will be celebrating Palm Sunday on April 28, with palms and all. There will be a special Good Friday Service at 6:00 PM, April 2nd. Then, of course, we will experience "LIFE" worship at our regular 9:00 o'clock worship service. This will be an "extra" special service, because we will be receiving the participants of our Confirmation Class into full membership of Holland First United Methodist Church. I invite you to affirm LIFE and experience the richness of God's grace!
